The Supreme Court rejected a dangerous elections theory. But it's not all good news.

Legal scholar Richard Pildes discusses the Supreme Court's recent decision to reject independent state legislature theory by a 6-3 margin in *Moore v. Harper* in this commentary. Had the Court upheld this view, state legislatures would have been permitted to regulate federal elections in any way they chose. However, Pildes cautions that while the Court did not accept North Carolina's extreme position to give its legislature free reign in such terms, the majority nonetheless failed to provide guidance on when a state has exceeded its regulatory authority. In Pildes view, therefore, a significant danger to democracy still remains to be addressed.
